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**Dear friends and respected seniors,**  
It gives me great pleasure to write to you again as your President elect.

These are difficult times and we're losing our beloved colleagues in bunches, that too sometimes as couples to Covid. On one side we have lost our senior vice President Dr. G. Kothandaraman and on the other side we're losing youngsters also who were frontline warriors in the battle against this invisible enemy. It's our duty to identify each and every such martyr, and get them the recognition they deserve. Solatium is a must but more importantly they should be recognised by the government for the sacrifice they've rendered by some award, honour or assistance to their family by way of employment by the state government. As an association it's our primary responsibility that the interest of our members are of paramount importance. I personally believe that since we're a professional body of medical doctors, our submission of a list that someone died of such and such disease is more than enough to substantiate claim for compensation. Also may I suggest that we give a small amount as an

expression of our love to the family of the bereaved soldier from the association so that the family gets reassured that they are not alone and that we are with them.

The Corona epidemic has also seen a fall in the enrolment of new members. I am afraid that in the coming months it's going to be difficult to meet the day to day expenditure of the state office unless we find a way to improve our membership. In this regard I request our branch office bearers to encourage more new members to join the association by letting them know about the various benefits of our schemes like FSS and PPLSSS.

My primary concern has been PPLSSS accounts which have been in trouble in recent times. I had already pointed out certain difficulties in my previous post. But fortunately the office bearers of PPLSSS have shown good response to the situation and with the help of the auditor they're trying to rewrite the whole accounts. I understand that the auditor is visiting PPLSSS office in person on August 14th and 15th and I hope things will be sorted out soon.

The only concern is the guest house accounts, where no proper income nor expenditure details are available. The receipts of income from guests have not been documented properly and on the other hand the expenditures are placed as handwritten vouchers without any stamped receipts to back up the claim. Many a times the expenditure is over and above the income and unusual money has been spent on daily provisions and vegetables. I've already discussed this in my last interaction and I again reiterate that strongest action should be taken against the manager of the PPLSSS guest house without showing any leniency.

As I have already pointed out receipts from the membership is very low due to the Covid epidemic and the worst sufferer is TIMA NEWS, as an interim arrangement I suggest that some major branches can contribute some money towards publication of the magazine by way of sponsorship through their own accruals or by raising advertisements. I request the major branches to consider my request.

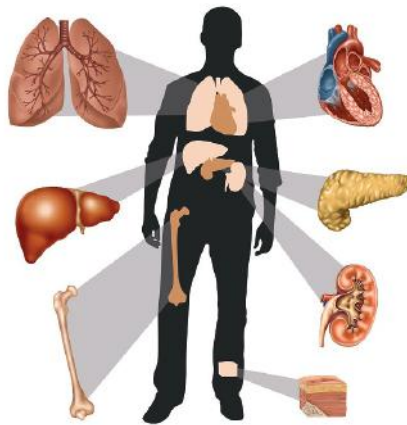

The World Organ donation day is celebrated on 13 August every year to give awareness about organ donation. The organ donation started from way back in our God – Vinayaga having elephant head, Mahabaratha depicting Karna donating his great services by donating blood, Kannappar donating eye to lord Shiva.

The Organ donation is a gift of life. There are two ways of donating organs, living related donors: As per Transplantation Of Human organ Act 1994 (TOHA) only immediate blood relatives (Brother, sister, parents and children) can donate the living organs, one kidney, portion of pancreas, part of liver.

Other donation is Cadaver organ donor- after brain death certified by the routine formalities can donate all organs. Healthy organs should be transplanted as soon as possible after brain death from donor, Heart, Heart Valves, Lung, Liver, Kidney, Pancreas and also Eye, Skin, Bone.

Any one can be a donor, regardless of age, race of gender., if the person is under age 18, need to have consent from parent or legal guardian. Donors who have given consent during life time should carry their donor cards with them and express their wishes to their near and dear ones. In case of no such consent or donor pledge form was filled before death, then



the relatives to give consent for organ. Donation lies with person lawfully in possession of the dead body.

By doing donation, the terminal disease in organs, heart – heart failure, lungs terminal lung illness, kidney- kidney failure, liver – liver coma and failure, pancreas – diabetes, eyes- blindness, heart valve – valvular disease, skin – burns can be cured.

## ORGAN DONATION AND BODY DONATION

The vital organs are transplanted into an individual who need urgently. After match to

receptients on the basis of medical suitability, urgency of transplantation based on waiting list and geographical location.

There is no charge or payment for organs / tissues used in transplantation. Organ donation is true gift. Removal of organs and tissues will not disfigure body, body can be viewed as in any case of death and funeral arrangement need not be

delayed. If any one, wants to donate body after death for anatomy dissection, it is called as body donation. For Body donation a consent might have been signed by the willing person in presence of two relatives and notary certification is needed and if consent not written during life, the close relatives, son, daughter, wife can give consent and donate the body. ■

**World First Aid Day** (12<sup>th</sup> September 2020) is a global observance day held every second Saturday of September. It was instituted by the International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies (IFRC) in 2000 and celebrated since then.

### FIRST AID

It is the immediate assistance or treatment given to someone before the arrival of medical staff or an ambulance.

#### Qualities of first aid:

- Calm
- Confident
- Willing to offer assistance whenever necessary
- Patience

#### Protecting yourself as first aid:

Essential to protect yourself from injury and Infection

- a) Ensure surroundings are safe
- b) Protection from infection
  - to prevent "cross infection"

(transmitting germs to a casualty or contracting an infection yourself)

- wear gloves or wash hands before doing a dressing.

#### AIMS OF FIRST AID: 3P's

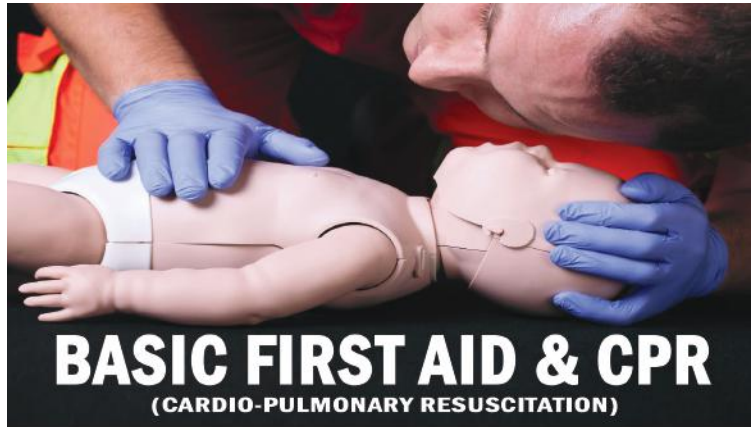
- ❖ Preserve life
- ❖ Prevent injuries/condition from worsening
- ❖ Promote recovery

#### Preserving life:

- 1) Control bleeding
- 2) Treat probable cause of shock
- 3) Maintain airway in correct position
- 4) Perform CPR when needed (no breathing or pulse)

#### Prevent condition from worsening:

- 1) Wound dressing to prevent infection
- 2) Provide comfort to the involved person
- 3) Place casualty in a comfortable position

#### Promote Recovery:

- 1) Relieve casualty from the anxiety
- 2) Encourage confidence and the trust
- 3) Attempt to relieve pain and discomfort
- 4) Handle casualty gently
- 5) Protect casualty from cold and wet

#### Emergency First Aid and CPR

(This presentation is not intended as a substitute for professional medical care)

#### EMERGENCY FIRST AID

If you are the first on the scene of an accident that results in an injury or grave illness, you may be the **only** link between a victim and emergency medical care. Your role is to **take action**, whether by providing first aid, seeking medical help, or calling **108**. Your immediate action improves the victim's chance of recovery.

#### BLEEDING

- **Apply direct pressure** to the wound (direct pressure bandage may be used)
- **Elevate** (do not further harm) -
- **Pressure Point:** additional pressure may be applied to a pressure point to help reduce bleeding.

#### Common pressure points:

- Arm between shoulder and elbow - brachial artery
- Groin area along bikini line - femoral artery
- Behind the knee - popliteal artery
- **Applying a tourniquet is a desperate & risk calculated move** - only for the most dire emergencies where the choice between life and limb must be made.



#### FIRST AID FOR SPRAINS AND STRAINS: I-C-E

- **I - Ice**, apply a cold pack. Do not apply ice directly to skin.
- **C - Compress**, uses an elastic or conforming wrap - *not too tight*.
- **E - Elevate**, above heart level to control internal bleeding.

#### CARE FOR DISLOCATIONS AND FRACTURES: I-A-C-T

- **I - Immobilize** area. Use pillows, jackets, blankets, etc. Stop any

movement by supporting injured area.

- **A - Activate** Emergency Medical Services (EMS), call **108**.
- **C - Care** for shock. See "Care for Shock" slide.
- **T - Treat** any additional secondary injuries.

#### Making a Pillow Splint

### POISONING

- Assess the scene for clues and safety.
- Get victim away from poison if necessary.
- Provide care for any life threatening conditions.
- Check Material Safety Data Sheet (MSDS).
- Notify medical staff or on-call Doctor.
- Call the Poison Control Center and **108** when necessary.

### EPILEPSY:

How to help someone with a seizure?

- Make them safe and prevent injury.
- Don't restrain the person.
- After the seizure, move them onto their side and tilt their head back & check for breathing.
- If necessary call ambulance 108

### Heat Exhaustion & Heatstroke

- Seek emergency medical assistance immediately
- If the casualty is unconscious, place them in the recovery position
- Remove most of the casualties clothing and sponge down the body with a cold and wet cloth
- Ice packs to the head, neck, armpits, and groin to reduce the casualties temperature.

- Provide them with cold water to sip if conscious and active.

### Burns and scalds: Causes:

BURNS - dry heat

- Fire - Hot objects - Electricity

SCALDS - wet heat

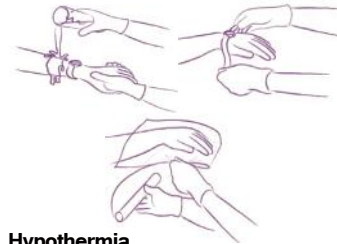
- Hot liquids - Steam

### What you will see in Burns and scalds

Redness Swelling  
Blisters Charred skin.

### What you should do

- remove any jewellery/metals
- cold running water (or tap water) 10 minutes (minimum)
- apply a sterile dressing or cling film
- treat the casualty for a shock if necessary
- seek medical help if essential.



### Hypothermia

- Warm the affected areas (warm water) only as long as there is no possibility of refreezing
- Remove involved areas from the water when returning to the normal.
- Do not rub frostbite or warm with direct heat (fires)
- Place gauze between the frostbite fingers or toes and bandage the affected areas loosely
- Seek medical help.

### ALLERGY:

Some of the more common symptoms or problems that one might experience due to allergies include:

- Runny nose,
- Burning, watery eyes
- Sinus congestion
- Postnasal drip
- Sore throat
- Skin rash
- Ear infections
- Chest congestion
- Coughing

- Headaches

- Fatigue

### Asthma Approaches to handling allergy problems

THE FIRST STEP IS TO AVOID CONTACT WITH SUBSTANCES THAT YOU ARE ALLERGIC TO IF YOU KNOW WHAT THEY ARE.

- When you are exposed to an allergen (something that you are allergic to), one of the symptoms is an increase in heart rate.
- The way to do this test is to take your pulse, at rest, for one minute. That is your "base" pulse.
- When you eat a food that is suspect or are exposed to a substance that is suspect, check your pulse again in 15, 30 and 60 minutes.
- If your heart rate accelerates more than 10 beats per minute over your base pulse, it indicates that you may be allergic to that particular substance.

ANOTHER METHOD FOR HANDLING ALLERGY PROBLEMS IS TO TAKE MEDICATIONS TO SUPPRESS YOUR ALLERGY SYMPTOMS.

### BITES & STINGS:

#### Bee, Wasps, Scorpion & Ant Stings

- Remove the sting by scraping sideways using a blunt knife or edge of the card.
- Place icepack on the affected area to reduce pain.
- Apply pressure immobilisation and seek urgent medical help.

### CARE FOR SHOCK

- Keep the victims lying down (if possible).
- Elevate legs 10-12 inches... unless you suspect a spinal injury or broken bones.
- Cover the victim to maintain body temperature.
- Provide the victim with plenty of fresh air.
- If the victim begins to vomit - place them on their left side. (lateral position)
- Call 108.

### BASIC LIFE SUPPORT:

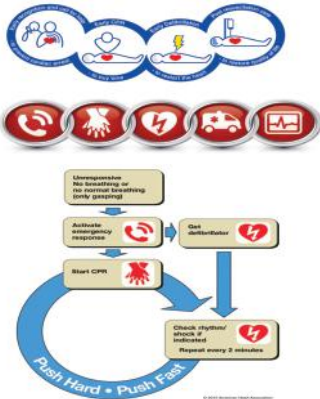
- Restore The Circulation Of Oxygenated Blood After A Sudden Pulmonary and/or Cardiac Arrest



- Performed By ANYONE Who Knows How To Do It, ANYWHERE, IMMEDIATELY, WITHOUT ANY OTHER EQUIPMENT

- A – Airway
- B – Breathing
- C – Circulation
- D - Defibrillation

**CHAIN OF SURVIVAL**



**Adult BLS Sequence**

- Immediate Recognition and Activation of the Emergency Response System
- Check Pulse
- Early CPR – Chest Compressions and rescue breaths
- Early Defibrillation With an AED (Automated External Defibrillator)

**1. CHECK RESPONSE**

Shake shoulders gently  
Ask "Are you all right?"  
If he responds



- Leave as you find him.
- Find out what is wrong. Reassess regularly.

**2. SHOUT FOR HELP**

**3. PULSE CHECK**

- Carotid Pulse
- Should not take more than 10 seconds to check for a pulse



**4. CHEST COMPRESSIONS**

- Forceful rhythmic applications of pressure over the lower half of the sternum.
- Create blood flow by increasing intrathoracic pressure and directly compressing the heart.
- This generates blood flow and oxygen delivery to the myocardium and the brain
  - Place the heel of one hand in the centre of the chest
  - Place another hand on top
  - Interlock fingers
- Compress the chest "push hard and push fast"
- Rate 100 min<sup>-1</sup>
- Depth 2 inches/ 5 cm
- Equal compression: relaxation
- Compression-ventilation ratio of 30:2 is recommended



**5. RESCUE BREATHS**

- A change in the 2010 AHA Guidelines for CPR and ECC is to recommend the initiation of compressions before ventilations
- **CAB instead of ABC**
- This shortens the delay of first compression
- Deliver each rescue breath over 1 second
- Give a sufficient tidal volume to produce visible chest rise
- Use a compression to ventilation ratio of 30 chest compressions to 2 ventilations

**OPEN AIRWAY**

**Head tilt and chin lift**

- lay rescuers
- Non-healthcare rescuers

**No need for finger sweep**

- unless solid material can be seen in the airway

**Head tilt, chin lift + jaw thrust**

- healthcare professionals



**RESCUE BREATHS:**

**mouth to mouth ventilation**

- Pinch the nose
- Take a normal breath
- Place lips over mouth
- Blow until the chest rises
- Take about 1 second
- Allow chest to fall
- Repeat



**Mouth-to-Barrier Device Breathing**

- Mouth-to-Nose and Mouth-to-Stoma Ventilation
- Ventilation With Bag and Mask
- Ventilation With a Supraglottic Airway such as the LMA

**CONTINUE CPR DEFIBRILLATION**

**AUTOMATED EXTERNAL DEFIBRILLATOR (AED):** Some AEDs will automatically switch on themselves when the lid is opened

**ATTACH PADS TO CASUALTY'S BARE CHEST**

**ANALYSING RHYTHM - DO NOT TOUCH VICTIM**

**SHOCK INDICATED - Stand clear & Deliver shock**

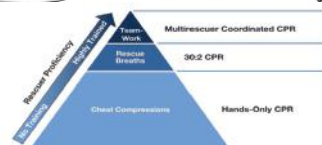

### Key changes in BLS Guidelines:

- Key changes in 2010 BLS from 2005 BLS Guidelines:
- Immediate recognition of sudden cardiac arrest based on assessing unresponsiveness and absence of normal breathing (ie, the victim is not breathing or only gasping)
- "Look, Listen, and Feel" removed from the BLS algorithm
- Encouraging Hands-Only (chest compression-only) CPR (ie, continuous chest compression over the middle of the chest) for the untrained lay-rescuer
- Sequence change to chest compressions before rescue breaths (CAB rather than ABC)
- Health care providers continue effective chest compressions/CPR until the return of spontaneous circulation (ROSC) or termination of resuscitative efforts
- Increased focus on methods to ensure that high-quality CPR (compressions of adequate rate and depth, allowing full chest recoil between compressions, minimizing interruptions in chest compressions and avoiding excessive ventilation) is performed
- Continued de-emphasis on pulse check for health care providers
- A simplified adult BLS algorithm is introduced with the revised traditional algorithm
- Recommendation of a simultaneous choreographed approach for chest compressions, airway management, rescue breathing, rhythm determination, and shocks (if appropriate) by an integrated team of highly-trained rescuers in appropriate settings

The covid-19 onslaught has raised questions about the survival of small and mid-sized hospitals.

These hospitals, provider of about 85% healthcare services in the country, have been bleeding as the pandemic has shifted focus from other services to treatment and management of only covid-19 patients. Small hospitals typically have up to 100 beds, medium-sized hospitals have more than 100 but less than 300 beds, while large hospitals have more than 300. The small and mid-size hospitals have suffered major losses and are facing a sustenance crisis. The small hospitals and nursing homes have been facing acute financial stress due to the sharp fall in people seeking regular treatment and surgeries owing to covid-19. Most of the small and mid-size hospitals do not have enough reserves and are facing cash flow challenges to even pay the salaries of their workers in accordance to a FCCI study for the period April to June 2020.

The government had kept the management of covid-19 cases restricted to public sector initially. Even during lockdown 1 and 2, closure of clinics and routine elective surgeries and administrative erratic orders like penalising a doctor or the nursing home to attend to covid-19 hospitals were sealed and some cases, FIRs

were lodged for either handling or for delayed information. This led to fear psychosis and thus closure of many small and medium-sized hospitals which are yet to get back to their feet and regain staff straight to per Covid era. Finance minister Niramala Sitharaman had announced ₹ 3 lakh crore emergency working capital facility for businesses, including MSMEs, ₹ 20,000 crore subordinate debt for stressed MSMEs, ₹ 50,000 crore equity infusion through MSME Fund of Funds, among other measures to help the sector. This could be the olive branch that small and mid-size hospitals need.

IMA recognising the same had apprised the government about the condition of such healthcare units, saying that the survival and viability of nursing homes and small hospitals in almost all the districts and towns is important for short- and long-term affordable care. The MSME ministry finally agreed that these hospitals can register in the MSME category. As far as the benefits are concerned, MSME will decide on it," was the

statement made by Arun Singhal, special secretary, Union Health Ministry. The move has been welcomed, it is a long pending demand put forth by small and mid-size Hospitals that has been finally recognised by the Government. Once registered through the online portal (<https://msme-registration.org/>) provided by the government the recognised Hospitals can avail the credit benefits announced by our finance minister at low interest rates through recognised finance institutes. The added benefits include easy availability of finance, collateral free loans, lower electricity bills, lower stamp duty charges, lower property taxes among other benefits.

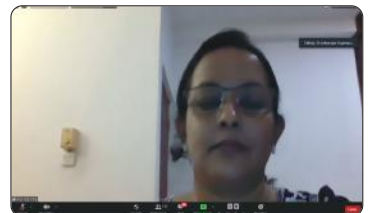
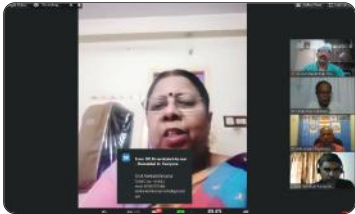

The announcement of inclusion of this sector under MSME has provided them with hope and encouragement. The financial back bone created by this recognition will help this sector weather this course of pandemic and help it to provide quality healthcare for all for many more years to come. The efforts by IMA to achieve this recognition has to be appreciated. All eligible members are encouraged to get registered as soon as possible to avail all the benefits. ■

## Greetings.

Government of Tamil Nadu is doing the best to fight COVID. We **INDIAN MEDICAL ASSOCIATION TAMIL NADU STATE BRANCH** have certain issues:

Govt., is insisting all the Private Hospitals to treat all Patients with universal precautions as if we deal with HIV patients. Nearly 85% COVID cases are Asymptomatic and most of the Patients who visit the NON COVID hospitals and clinics may be positive. In such cases we are forced to do COVID tests before taking up for any procedures and admissions. But there is acute shortage of Private COVID testing centers in semi urban and rural areas which increases the load to Government labs. COVID collection centers may be allowed in such areas by the Govt.

Safety precautions and all Guidelines to follow are costly and reflect on patients.

Man power shortage is the major problem and we have to pay more and also give incentives and insurance coverage's, and frequently motivate them frequently to retain the staffs. Naturally these cost have to reflect on to the patients.

On one side Govt. is capping the prices where there is a wide gap with the Actual expenditure a private concern meets out and will lead to constrained treatment. Govt. Hospitals can do because they have enough man power and Govt. is taking care of all the expenses.

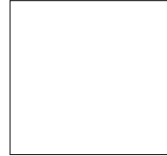

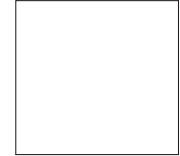

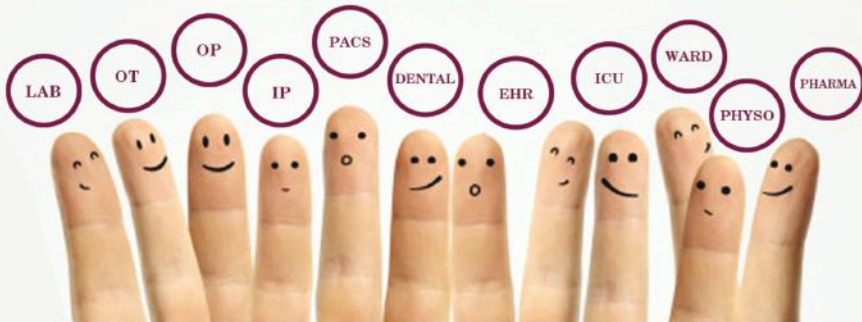
